#### Debrief on the Lake House meeting- Rachel

This was a great day. Thanks to all who participated and to Michele for taking notes. In time, Rachel will develop more formal documentation of the flood response and recovery and will pull out potential action steps to improve preparedness from the discussions that day.

### **Update on flood relief funding** – Christopher

Final decisions were made week before Thanksgiving. Katherine Sims did amazing work. The final list of impacted organizations did differ from what VACDaRN had been able to compile. There were 42 applicants and 38 were funded. The awards total \$400K; \$200K from the NEH and a less restricted \$200K that VHC raised. Six contracts are being held while the applicants await determination if they are eligible for FEMA Public Assistance. No announcement of the award has been made because of their uncertain status.
